



2018 - A year in the life of Get Doncaster Moving

Since the review of physical activity and sport in 2016, Doncaster has been working hard to address physical inactivity. The first two years of our journey in 2016 and 2017 positioned physical activity as a strategic priority within the borough's inclusive growth ambitions; aiming to reduce inequalities within our communities by addressing inactivity levels. 2018 has started to turn our ambitions into reality, with the Local Delivery Pilot (LDP) and Get Doncaster Moving (GDM) programmes developing together at pace. However, we recognise that we still have a long way to go in our journey towards 'healthy and vibrant communities through physical activity and sport.'

Castle Park hosts Yorkshire's first ever senior England women's international (attendance 3,876)
Yorkshire Sport Foundation are awarded funding from the Sport England TIED fund, to deliver 'Active Dearne'

The first LDP Leadership Group meeting takes place to provide strategic advice for the development and delivery of the LDP.
Work starts to appoint an LDP evaluation partner.

Doncaster announced as the start for stage 1 of the Tour de Yorkshire, starting at the Market.

Community Insight Phase 2 – SHU train 'Community Explorers' from a number of voluntary sector groups, they will engage with residents through face-to-face conversations, focus groups and events.

Grant funding received from British Cycling, work starts on the Cycle Circuit at Doncaster Dome.
Assistant Transport Planner (Active Travel Auditor) in place, to review and audit active travel plans across the borough.

Community Insight Phase 3 – Interventions, services and opportunities co-designed with communities.

Walking and Cycling Officer in post, there is now a full GDM delivery team in place. The first partnership meeting is held with National Governing Bodies.
A GDM Network Meeting focuses on the final systems mapping workshop, Sport Participation, EXPECT Youth and Dance. 'Future Parks' Workshops are held to prioritise future improvements in Doncaster parks Doncaster.

Community Insight Phase 1 - SHU start surveying with 1,200 households in nine communities.

Sports Participation Officer joins the team.
The first meeting of the Active Schools Group takes place to address actions in the GDM strategy relating to PE and school sport.

Enhanced capacity with the Local Delivery Pilot Manager and Data Analyst in place.
The Centre for Behavioural Science and Applied Psychology at SHU are commissioned to undertake 'Community Insight', to understand people's everyday experiences.

Sheffield Hallam University (SHU) complete a desktop evidence review that focuses on the role of community involvement and development to reduce barriers to participation in physical activity.

Doncaster progresses through the first round of bidding to host the Rugby League World Cup in 2021.

The second 'Systems Mapping' workshop takes place, with over 30 stakeholders from across the system contributing.
The LDP Business Change Managers attend the first National LDP Network Meetings.

The route for Yorkshire 2019 UCI Road World Championships is announced, starting at the new cycle track.

One Dance UK receive a full award from the Sport England 'Active Ageing' fund. Led locally by DARTS, the Dance Activator Programme aims to engage inactive older people.
The Arts and Health Project Board recognises 'Dance' within their governance structures.

Leeds Beckett University publish a Social Impact Assessment of the Tour de Yorkshire, providing recommendations to increase community engagement.
The first 'Systems Mapping' workshop takes place with Dr Nick Cavill and Prof Harry Rutter to produce a map of the local physical activity system.

The first School Active Travel awards celebrate schools and individuals working hard to increase in walking, cycling and scooting to school.

Doncaster's first ever Walking Strategy is approved by the council Cabinet, with the vision for Doncaster to be a place where walking is an integral part of everyday life.

Sport England allocate staff resource to Doncaster and work starts to mobilise the LDP.

Leeds Beckett University are commissioned to produce a social impact assessment of the 2018 Tour de Yorkshire in Doncaster to understand the social impacts of large-scale sports events.

Sport England award £369,868 to Doncaster for the LDP's development period. This includes staffing capacity, systems mapping and community insight research. The LDP Business Change Managers attend the first National LDP Network Meetings.

The GDM Strategy is formally launched at the first GDM Summit, with over 70 attendees from a range of organisations.

Doncaster hosts the first stage of the Tour de Yorkshire elite men's race and the women's Tour de Yorkshire on 3 May.
