
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This Report

This report focuses on the community of Barnby Dun, part of the Barnby Dun ward in the East of the City and begins with a summary outlining key information and priorities. This document builds on the initial conversations with communities, including ward members, community organisations, faith groups, residents and other organisations who work in the area. Communities' knowledge of their own areas enables them to identify their strengths and the assets on which they can build on. This document is shared with the intention of supporting those conversations and sharing information that might not be readily available to local people.

Barnby Dun community is represented as accurately as possible in this report. Much of the health and population data presented in this report for Barnby Dun.

This community profile is a light touch and we have separated the data from some of the Ward data.

One Page Summary

This report focuses on the community of Barnby Dun which is part of the Stainforth and Barnby Dun ward in the East of the City. The ward is split geographically and economically into two distinct communities; Barnby Dun is smaller in population and more affluent than Stainforth. Stainforth has a population of 6,400 with 2,700 households. 91.1% of households are whole houses or bungalows and there's high number of caravans or other mobile structures 2.3%, compared to England (0.4%).

The Stainforth and Barnby Dun ward has an Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) Score of 35.1, however broken down into community level Stainforth has an IMD score of 51.8 and is the 6th most deprived in the city, where-as Barnby Dun is 10.1 and is ranked 83 out of 88 communities in Doncaster.

Key Health priorities

Barnby Dun

- Higher prevalence of smokers than the borough's average which can lead to respiratory conditions, the leading cause of mortality in the area.
- · High levels of obesity and heart disease.
- High levels of residents living alone which indicates Loneliness and Isolation.

Assets

Well Doncaster uses a community centred approach which allows investment in supporting, working with, and empowering communities to facilitate a healthy community. The voice and role of our communities and taking a strength or assets-based approach to work with individuals, families and communities is crucial to the achievement of our overall vision.

Asset Maps

The Stainforth and Barnby Dun ward is split geographically and economically into two distinct communities, each having its own assets. It is appreciated that these maps are a starting point in understanding the communities and that further work in needed amongst the community to further understand all the assets and how they are used.

The maps below outline the ward boundaries and show different types of assets across Stainforth & Barnby Dun.




Figure 1 - Stainforth and Barnby Dun Ward Health Assets




Figure 2 - Stainforth and Barnby Dun Ward Business Assets





Figure 3 - Stainforth and Barnby Dun Ward Community Asset

Health and Wealth

Deprivation

Health inequalities are avoidable differences across the population and between different groups within society. Health inequalities arise from the conditions in which we live, work and play. These conditions influence our opportunities for good health, how we think, feel and act, therefore shaping our health and wellbeing.

Evidence shows that people living in our most deprived areas face the worse health inequalities in relation to health access, experiences, and outcomes. Deprivation covers a range of issues and refers to unmet needs caused by a lack of resources, including but not limited to finances, housing, and education. It is measured in different ways including the Indices of Multiple Deprivation (IMD). Doncaster is within the 10% most deprived communities in England.

The map below shows Barnby Dun is in the 80 % most deprived communities in Doncaster.





Figure 4 - Doncaster borough deprivation by LSOA

IMD data shows deprivation levels have increased in Barnby Dun between 2015 and the most recent data collected in 2019. As it can be seen in the table below. Barnby Dun has been the 7th most deprived community in Doncaster in both 2015 and 2019 and has become more deprived according to national rankings (escalating to position 793).

The IMD measures relative levels of deprivation in small areas, called Lower-layer Super Output Areas (LSOA). Using LSOA's in Stainforth and Barnby Dun highlights the difference in levels of deprivation across the ward. The table and map below show two of the three LSOAs in Barnby Dun to be in the top 20 least deprived LSOAs in Doncaster. Whereas three of the four LSOAs which make up Stainforth are in the lowest IMD decile and in the top 20 most deprived communities in Doncaster.



The 2021 Census data has been used to produce estimates that classify households in England and Wales by four dimensions of deprivation: employment, education, health and disability, and household overcrowding.




Figure 6 – Barnby Dun household deprivation (Census 2021)

The Census 2021 data breaks down this information into household deprivation within Barnby Dun area compared to Doncaster and England.

49.1% of households in Barnby Dun are not deprived in any dimensions which is higher than Doncaster (43.7%) and England (48.4%).

Similarly, 34.8% of households are deprived in One dimension higher than Doncaster (34.7%) and England (33.5%) and households deprived in three dimensions (1.8%) are significantly lower than Doncaster (4.6%) and England (3.7%).

The graphic below illustrates the differences between Stainforth and Barnby Dun. Stainforth has a significantly higher prevalence of output areas which are deprived in 3 dimensions.

St Leger has government affordable housing within the Doncaster borough. There are 61 St Leger properties in Barnby Dun 32 of these are 3 bed houses and 10 are 2 bed bungalows. Total amount of rent arrears between 21-22 was £2,191.00 and rent arrears between 22-23 £3,728.00, this amount risen within 4 years.

Citizen's advice Doncaster Borough

In Barnby Dun there are 119 residents who are seeking support the Citizens advice which is out of 9000 residents in Doncaster. Please see the diagram below, the purple dots show Barnby Dun residents are seeking the support.




Figure 8 - Barnby Dun Citizen's advice- top 5 issues

Poverty

A significantly high proportion of Stainforth and Barnby Dun residents are experiencing income deprivation (20.2%), This is significantly higher than Doncaster (16.6%) and England (12.9%). 29.5% of children in Stainforth and Barnby Dun are living in poverty, significantly higher than Doncaster (22.7%) and England (17.1%). Furthermore, 17.8% of older people are also living in poverty which is higher than Doncaster (15.9%) and England (14.2%). These deprivation indicators are illustrated in the chart below comparing the Stainforth and Barnby Dun ward to England. From the IMD LSOA breakdown it can be assumed that the majority of those experiencing income deprivation child poverty live in Stainforth. or




Figure 9 - Deprivation indicators - Stainforth and Barnby Dun

Fuel poverty is defined as a household living on a lower income which is not deemed reasonable enough to warm a home sufficiently. In 2020, (19.6%) of adults in Stainforth and Barnby Dun were unable to warm their homes to a reasonable standard which is higher than Doncaster (18.8%) and significantly higher than England (13.2%). The recent cost of living crisis including rising fuel costs and inflation may be a contributing factor.




Figure 10 - Barnby Dun& Stainforth Fuel poverty heat map

Another measure which may indicate deprivation is the number of cars in each household. There are significant differences between Barnby Dun and Stainforth. This should also be considered when considering health interventions between the communities as it may be a barrier to accessing services. This is illustrated in the graphic below.




Figure 11 - Households without a car or Van, 2021 Census

Employment

In Barnby Dun 23.3% of residents aged 16 and over who are not in employment and have never worked, significantly higher than Doncaster (27.2%) and England (25.6%).

In Barnby Dun, of those economically active in employment is 47.0% is lower than Doncaster 54.9% and lower than England 57.4%

Occupation figures highlighted those in Elementary Occupations (8.0%) is lower than Doncaster (16.5%) and England (10.5%) skilled trades occupation (12.2%), higher than Doncaster (11.7%) and England (10.2). Traditionally these roles are low skill and low pay roles. Furthermore, 17.2% are employed in Professional Occupations, higher Doncaster (12.8) and England (20.3%), usually requiring higher skill levels, education and receive higher pay.

People living in Barnby Dun aged 16 years and older have no qualifications (22.7%) compared to Doncaster (24.6%) and England (18.1%).






Figure 13 – Employment History, Occupation & Highest level of Qualification for Barnby Dun compared to England

Childhood Development

In 2021 the data showed that 28.6% of children are overweight or obese at reception age in Stainforth and Barnby Dun. This has now decreased to 26.0% Doncaster (26.1%) but still significantly higher than England (22.6%). This increases to 38.5% in year 6 whereas previous data showed 34.2%, Doncaster (38.2%) and England (35.8%).

In Stainforth and Barnby Dun the prevalence of regular smokers at age 15 (7.1%) are higher than Doncaster (6.8%) and England (5.4%) and the deliveries to teenage mothers (1.7%) are

significantly higher than Doncaster (1.1%) and England (0.7%). Furthermore, the general fertility rate, which is live births per 100.0 women aged 15-44, is higher (70.7) than Doncaster (62.4) and England (59.2). These figures are all the same as reported in 2021.

In 2020, emergency admissions in under 5s are both higher in Stainforth and Barnby Dun than Doncaster (91.1 per 100.0) but lower than England (140.7 per 100.0). Emergency hospital admissions for under 15-year-olds (95.1 per 100.0) are higher than Doncaster (88.8 per 100.0) and England (92.0 per 100.0).

The Pupil Lifestyle Survey is conducted by City of Doncaster Council to provide valuable data on children and young people's health-related behaviour, through an anonymous school-based questionnaire. Data from the survey has provided a set of Doncaster-wide figures at key points in children and young people's development; KS2, 3 and 4. This profile will compare the previous 2020 data with that collected most recently in 2022.

In Stainforth and Barnby Dun 104 pupils participated. 84% of participants have breakfast, this is lower than the Doncaster (86%) and the same as 2021. The survey also indicated that 27% of school-aged children in Stainforth have free school meals, this is higher than Doncaster (19%) and the same as 2021. 96% have a healthy food and beverage intake and 18% claimed to consume takeaway food most or every day (*vs* 15% across Doncaster). However, daily fruit consumption is only 66%, lower than Doncaster (68%).

95% of children reported they feel warm and comfortable at home which is lower than Doncaster (97%). 83% felt able to clean themselves at home, also lower than Doncaster (90%). 2021 data showed that only 67% of school children in Stainforth felt able to have a restful night's sleep, this has now increased to 74% yet still lower than Doncaster (80%).

89% of Children reported that they felt safe at home which matches Doncaster and 79% have a nice, safe place at home or near home to play (Doncaster average 85%).

68% of school children in Stainforth surveyed reported that they feel able to get involved in the wider community which has increased compared to previous data 54%, and higher than Doncaster (62%). Shaping Stainforth, consequently, targeted gathering insight from young people to ensure they had a voice in future.

It is important to note that the Pupil Lifestyle Survey is self-reported and was not completed by all the schools.

Long Term Health Conditions

In Stainforth and Barnby Dun, the number of people who report to be living with a long-term limiting illness (23.8%) or having bad or very bad health (8.7%) is significantly worse than for England and Doncaster. The percentage of residents in Barnby Dun with a long-term condition (19.3%.), although lower than in Stainforth, is also significantly worse than rates reported for England. However, most residents of Barnby Dun describe their own health as "good".

Barnby Dun residents are suffering from Respiratory and heart conditions and are the leading cause of mortality and emergency hospital admissions. Prevalence of contributing risk factors remain high: 29.2% of adults in the community are obese and 24.7% of adults participate in binge drinking, although these figures are not significantly different to the England average. Smoking prevalence is high at 21.5%.

Stainforth and Barnby Dun residents aged 65 and over are reported to visit hospital due to hip fractures. There are 10.6% residents aged 70 to 74 compared to Doncaster 5.3% and England 5.0%.





Figure 14 - Barnby Dun Hospital admissions Harm and Injury from the Local health

The graph below shows the percentage of the population in Barnby Dun and Stainforth ward causes of death which relate to health conditions. The prevalence of all these health conditions is higher in Barnby Dun and Stainforth than the borough's average. The significantly high level of emphysema, coupled with the significantly higher proportion of deaths from respiratory diseases. Field road surgery's partnership with Barnby Dun has reported 20.60% of active smokers this covers Stainforth area, Doncaster is 17.96%.

Barnby Dun Playing Fields has the highest rate when broken down in LSOA 44.9 per 1000 per population alcohol specific between 2016-July 2023, this was the highest record in the borough.

The 2021 census data is showing that Barnby Dun 37.7% have good health which is higher than Doncaster (34.1%). The percentage of residents with bad health is 4.4%, higher than England (4.0%).



Life Expectancy

At a community level Barnby Dun (82.4 males) & (83.7 females) compared to Stainforth, males (76.9) and females (80.5) have a significantly shorter life expectancy when compared to their counterparts.

Seen in the graph below at ward level Stainforth and Barnby Dun the life expectancy combined males (78.3) and females (81.5) which is higher than Doncaster male (77.9) and female (81.3).




Figure 16 - Barnby Dun& Stainforth local health- Life expectancy




Figure 17 - Barnby Dun& Stainforth life expectancy heat map

Loneliness and Isolation

In Barnby Dun 29.3% of residents live with 1 person in a household compared to England (30.1%). 46.0% of people live with 2 people within a household compared with England (34.0%). 13.3% of residents live with 3 people with slightly higher compared to England (16.0%). In the household composition in Barnby Dun, 68.4% of residents live in a single-family household and is higher than England (63.0%).

In Barnby Dun there is 10, 1 bedroom St Leger bungalows most of these properties will sit in line with the 29.3% of residents that live with a household who has 1 person.

Whilst this does not indicate loneliness and/or isolation, it is an indicator to be considered alongside local intelligence.





Figure 18 – Barnby Dun household size/household composition (Census 2021)

Physical activity

The following map show where there are high numbers of inactive households around the borough. Data is mapped to Lower Super Output Areas, but wards are shown and labelled for orientation. This can be seen in the map below, which identifies areas with the highest number of inactive households. This data has been matched to the number of children and young people living in deprived and inactive households. People living in income deprivation means only people living on social benefits but also in low income or/or precarious work.

Barnby Dun has lower number of inactive population when compared to the other areas.



The Pupil Lifestyle Survey showed that 43% of Stainforth and Barnby dun ward, school children reported walking to school, in line with the Doncaster average of 43% and physical activity via school clubs is 18%, similar to the Doncaster average of 19%. Around 83% of school children in Stainforth who took part in the survey reported that they enjoyed physical activity (Doncaster's average 76%) and the number of days of physical activity matches those reported for Doncaster. For those who reported not enjoying physical activity, the most common reason was 'getting hot and tired' (50%).

Prevention and Control

Vaccinations

Vaccination uptake data shows Barnby Dun 1st dose of vaccine in 2023 90.7% which is higher than the uptake of the second dose which is 88.2%.




Figure 19 - Barnby Dun vaccine uptake 2023

Recovery

The Coronavirus pandemic has had a huge impact on our communities and work continues to focus on the recovery stage of the pandemic. As a part of the recovery approach, Well Doncaster have secured funding from the Ministry of Housing Communities and Local Government for Third Sector organisations across the borough to employ Community Connectors. Their role comprises understanding the barriers and work with residents to create solutions that increase vaccination uptake and compliance to social distancing in disadvantaged groups. They also encourage and support those most affected by COVID-19 and engage them in community events and services.

Population Health Management

Covid-19 has had a huge impact on communities. It is vital to understand the effect and direction the pandemic has had on community organisation in the ward so that: 1) support can be offered and 2) work can be implemented to manage any gaps or risks associated with changes. To support the former, Well Doncaster officers undertake regular population health management insight with community organisations in Stainforth, identifying their status and needs and work with each group to meet their goals. 


Figure 20 – Age profile of Barnby Dun compared to Doncaster, 2021

Ethnicity and Language

Barnby Dun continues to be predominantly White British (98.5%), higher than Doncaster (93.1%) and England (81.0%). 0.3%% of the population are Black, Black British or Black Welsh, lower than Doncaster (1.2%) and England (4.2%). 0.5% are Asian, Asian British or Asian Welsh, lower than Doncaster (2.9%) and England (9.6%) In addition. Only 0.6% of residents are from mixed or other ethnic groups, significantly lower than Doncaster (2.7%) and England (5.2%).





Figure 21- Barnby Dun Ethnicity & Proficiency in English profiles, Census 2021

Housing

Housing conditions and the surrounding environment can have profound impacts upon residents' health and exacerbate health inequalities. The data in figures 23 and 24 below explores several variables to analyse the housing in Stainforth, this is important given its highly dense nature.

There are 6,100 households in Stainforth. 2021 census data shows that 12.3% of houses in Barnby Dun are socially rented, this is lower than Doncaster (17.0%), residents who owns their homes with a mortgage or loan or shared ownership 32.4% which is higher than Doncaster 29.6%. 90.9% of homes in Barnby Dun is whole house or bungalow, this is higher than the Doncaster average. 64.6% Barnby Dun residents are living in of single-family household which is higher than Doncaster 64.1 and England 63.0%.






Figure 22. Housing profiles in Barnby Dun, Census 2021

Stronger communities' insight

Stronger communities' data shows the vulnerable victims in the East area of Doncaster. As seen in the graph below the number of vulnerable victims that are being supported by the Stronger Communities team. East area of Doncaster has the highest number compared to the other localities.




Figure 23 – Stronger community's data for vulnerable victims in the East area

Community Investment

The East locality has received £775,000 of community investment through the Well Doncaster team. Of this, £194.52 has been directly invested in the Stainforth and Barnby Dun ward. The investment into Barnby Dun has been £14,000 which Friday's men club was allocated the Locality Commissioning for their community allotment.

Food bank insight

There are 5 active foodbanks in the East locality of Doncaster. They are in several communities throughout, none in Barnby Dun.

Community Insight

Appreciative Inquiry

The Well Doncaster Team undertake Appreciative Inquiry (AI) within communities to gather insight to support code signing action plans with the community. Armstrong (2020) suggests in 'A changing world, again. How Appreciative Inquiry can guide our growth' that reframing the questions considering a crisis like Covid-19 and drawing on strengths and assets from

past positive experience will help participants as they restructure their community. The Al questions are structured to pull out the successes of the past and present, to seek new potentials and possibilities and build on those through the Dream and Design stages.

Appreciative Inquiry will be conducted in Barnby Dun from July 2021. The Appreciative Inquiry will include the following steps:

- 1. **Discovery Phase** This will involve engagement with the residents of Barnby Dun to find out what is working well in the community. Responses will be themed to allow priorities of the community to be established.
- 2. **Dream** Residents and key stakeholders will be invited to attend an initial workshop to discuss what ideas they have for their community and how these will meet the priorities highlighted in the discovery phase.
- 3. **Design** All attendees are invited back for a second workshop to develop an action plan to direct work for the community.
- 4. **Deliver** A collaborative way of working and investing resources in working towards to the actions from the previous phase.

Well Doncaster is starting to work in Barnby Dun from 2023. Well Doncaster officers will be going into community assets and having strength base conversations with residents throughout the Barnby Dun ward.

Locality plans

The 2023, East Locality Plan looks back at what has been achieved throughout 2022 and sets out the plan for how this work will continue and grow over the next 12 months, by all Team Doncaster partners to hear the voices of local people, to understand the strengths in our neighbourhoods and build capacity in communities so that they can take control of their own destiny.

The community conversations have been informed by the Appreciative Inquiry.

Doncaster Talks

In 2019, Doncaster Talks undertook insight across the borough of Doncaster. Responses were separated into wards and thematically analysed.



The Physically Inactive Population of Doncaster

The MOSAIC types who "Do not exercise" and "Do not take part in Sport" were searched and three priority groups have been identified through work with strategic partners as part of the development of Doncaster's Physical Activity Strategy. The three priority groups are:

- The Inactive
- Families with children and young people
- People living in income deprivation

These groups are cross-referenced against the inactivity list allowing for the identification of MOSAIC types which are both likely to be inactive and living in deprivation as well as inactive and from households with children and young people.
